## FAMILY MATH NIGHT Dassports

As students enter the event, have the greeters hand them their passport. Or students can pick them up at the sign-in table. If the passports are going to be collected at the end of the evening for a raffle, be sure to have students write their name and teacher's name on the back.

Students (or parents/guardians) can decide if they want to wear the passport as a bracelet, necklace, or simply carry it with them from station to station.

These passports are used as students rotate to the various stations. Once finished at the station, the station facilitator adds a small sticker or some sort of stamp next to the station name indicating that the student completed the activity at the station.

## Ideas for the passports

- Collect the passports at the end of the event and use them in a raffle for a prize.
- Students who complete at least 4 of the stations\* get an extra guess in the estimation jar.
- Students who complete at least 4 of the stations\* can collect a small prize.
- The passport is theirs to take home as a reminder of the fun they had at Family Math Night.

Whichever idea you choose, be sure your greeters share how the passports will be used as they hand them out.

\* Family Math Night is designed to be a go-at-your-own pace, stress-free event. Therefore it's important that students don't feel pressured to get to all of the stations. We believe visiting 4 stations during a 90-minute event is attainable for most participants. However, you may want to change the minimum number of stations depending on your circumstances.
