Tens are Terrific Additional Versions

All of the games below can be played using dot dice. If you would like to make the number cube, see the dice net in the PDF resources.

TENS are terrific



VERSION 1 Each player lists the numbers 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 vertically on paper. Players take turns rolling the dot die and determining how many more are needed to make a ten.

Example: Rolled How many more do I need to get to 10? + ? = 10

The player places a tally mark next to the number that makes 10 (in this case, the number '6'). The first player to get five tally marks for any of their numbers is the winner.

sample game:	PLAYER 1	PLAYER 2
	4	4
	5	5
	6	6 ← 5 tally marks wins
	7	7
	8	8
	9	9

VERSION 2 Play is the same as Version 1 except replace the dot die with the number cube.

VERSION 3 Each player lists the numbers 8 – 18 vertically on paper. Players take turns rolling both dot dice and finding the sum (add the numbers together). Players then determine how many more are needed to make 20 and place a tally mark next to that number. The first player to get five tally marks for any of their numbers is the winner.

VERSION 4 Play is the same as Version 3 except use the number cube and the dot die.
